Formerly she got her title in History at the Facultad de Filosofía y Letras, Tucumán University. Nowadays she is Adjunct Professor full-time and teaches Introduction of Archaeology; Field Practices I and Conservation and Cultural Management on Archaeological Resources at the Faculty of Natural Sciences and Miguel Lillo Institute, University of Tucumán. Since March of 2000 she is Director (for election of their members) of the Archaeology and Museum Institute; until then was a Member of the Directing Council. She has participated in numerous archaeological research projects with economic support from CIUNT, CONICET and Agencia de Promoción Científica y Tecnológica. She is member of the project Archaeology Institute Reorganization supported by Antorchas Foundation and directed by Carlos Aschero. Is also member of winner project M97-412 FYPF directed by Carlos Aschero. At present she is directing the project " Mobility, articulation and change. Archaeology and history of valleys, ravine and plain at Tucumán" inside the Program CIUNT 2001-2003 headed by Carlos Aschero. Since 98 she is directing historic archaeological researches at San José de Lules and Avellaneda Memorial House at Tucumán province. She has been frequently consulted on different subjects, pointing out those related to relocation of the menhirs of Tafi del Valle; also adviser on archaeological subject to the Cultural Secretary of Tucumán province; coordinates the Archaeological Commission for Cultural Resources of the province; she was consulted on Cultural Impacts for the UNESCO and Minera Alumbra and collaborator to reviewing the plan of the Archaeology Career.

Her publishes inside the country and abroad (Chile, Bolivia, Sweden) are related mostly with megaliths, Tafi's archaeology and recently about historic archaeology. She has assisted to numerous national and international congresses in Sweden, Chile and Bolivia. She has several field works, and surveys in Tucumán and Catamarca provinces. She made different development and transfer of knowledge activities through lectures one of them at the Riksantikvarieämbetet, also radio and television programs.

She can speak English as well as French. She got a fellowship on archaeological research in Tafi del Valle (CONICET) and another one to participate in the Symposium of Megaliths and Social Geography, Falköping, Sweden. Nowadays she is working in Archaeological Law Protection. She has special interest in Formative archaeology; megaliths; symbolic systems; rock art and cultural resources management.
